# Welcome back to Le Rosey's 131<sup>st</sup> Year

We should like to extend a warm welcome to a hundred new Roséens about to discover a new school with the help and good will of returning students whom we are naturally delighted to welcome back. We look forward to meeting you all in September, and, in the meantime, offer you some summer thoughts.

1. **This year we intend to continue with the development of our “Highest Achievement” and “Honour” study groups, the “Excellence Challenge” and, more generally, with our commitment to ensure that all Roséens produce the best possible academic work.** The principle is simple: it is not enough to “do well”: our students must do their best and achieve results in line with their professional and college ambitions. Passing the French bac or the IB is not enough for the most prestigious universities: they require mentions or top grades based on years of regular and conscientious study. Le Rosey offers the possibility of exceptional results to all who can make a sustained effort. We shall place particular emphasis on these ambitions this year through a range of support and encouragement – including tutors to provide individualized attention, more formal and informal assessment, motivational programmes, leadership weekends, and an introduction to meditation.

2. **Our programme of Wednesday lectures and dinners (or Speakers' Program), continues to thrive,** as testified by the number of reports of these on the Rosey website and in the Yearbook. It is an area where we would be grateful for your help and collaboration: we are constantly on the lookout for speakers able to give Roséens an insight into political, economic or cultural matters. We have had the good fortune to see writers, ambassadors, lawyers, bankers, industrialists and philosophers inspire our students. We would be delighted to hear from you if you would like to offer your services as a speaker or are able to put us in contact with someone you consider of particular interest. 3. **A few facts and figures at the close of the 130<sup>th</sup> year:**

- The unquestioned principle of academic life at Le Rosey, and the background against which academic results are set, is that all students without exception must sit rigorous external exams – either the French *baccalauréat* or the full diploma of the International Baccalaureate: there is no option of sitting only IB certificates or preparing a “High School Diploma”.
- A record number of 73 students sat the International Baccalaureate: all but two (who are awaiting the final result) obtained the diploma. The average score was nearly 32 points. All in all, a very good year.
- Yet another 100% pass rate at the French baccalaureate: 8 candidates, 4 mentions (trés bien, bien and assez bien) and an overall average of 12.5 out of 20.
- At the fête de fin d'année, 105 students received an Honour Prize for an annual average above 5.8/7 or 13/20 – of whom 36 deserved the accolade of a “Highest Achievement” prize for a year's average of 6.3/7 or 15/20 and above. This figure represents 26.3% of our student body, slightly down against last year's 29% but with an increase in the proportion of those with “Highest Achievement” (9% against 7.8% last year).
- To our regret, we were unable to readmit seven students for the coming year, either on academic grounds or because they were did not respect the rules of Rosey life.

4. **This year's Class t sent off more than 600 university applications!**

- 50 students submitted over 415 applications to 129 different universities in the United States and Canada with a higher than average level of success within the Ivy + category of universities: an overall 20% of submitted applications accepted. - **33 Class t students submitted applications for 154 courses in the United Kingdom.** The most popular courses still tend to be business related, followed by International Relations. London remains the favoured destination in terms of applications submitted, with University College London the most popular this year with applications to 16 courses. Similarly, the London School of Economics and Queen Mary University each had 11 applications. **The class of 2010 received offers from the universities of:** Birmingham, Brighton, Bristol, Brunel, City, Derby, Durham, East Anglia, Edinburgh, Exeter, Glasgow, Goldsmith's, Imperial, King's, Kingston, Leeds, L.S.E., Loughborough, London Metropolitan, Manchester Metropolitan, Newcastle, Nottingham, Nottingham Trent, Oxford Brookes, Univ.of Plymouth, Queen Margaret, Queen Mary, Robert Gordon, Royal Holloway, School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), Southampton, St Andrews, Sussex, Univ of the Arts, University College London (UCL), Warwick, Univ of West England, Westminster, York.
- **Students in Class t also received offers from:** Technical University of Delft, Ecole hôtelière de Lausanne, HEC Genève et Lausanne, Parson's School of Design Paris, Ecole Camondo Paris, American University of Beirut, Webster University Geneva, ECAL (Lausanne), Université Paris Descartes, Université Paris Pierre et Marie Curie, ESCE Lyon, ISCPA Lyon (Journalisme), ESMOD Paris, Université Lyon Lumière.

5. **Admissions for 2010-11** were finalized by the end of March with only a few adjustments following the occasional replacement of departing students from our waiting list. We have received over 400 applications for the places left by our 81 graduating students and approximately 27 other students leaving for various reasons. In September, these 100 newcomers will be amongst the 170 boys, 170 girls, and 50 Juniors, who, along with teachers' children, will make up a 400-strong student body.
6. **On the financial front**, a number of extra activities are now included in the tuition fees and will no longer be billed. These are obligatory activities such as the week-end de connaissance, the formal balls, Gstaad ski excursions, and all expeditions. The table below provides further details; Mr Marc Brondex, who deals with all enquiries to the accounting department, will be happy to answer any questions you may have.

### Points Regarding this School Year:

- **The 2010-11 Codes** have undergone their usual summer update: you can find the Codes in the download section of the “Information” tab on the Rosey website [www.rosey.ch](http://www.rosey.ch)
- **The Rosey Dress Code**, if anyone needs to be reminded, contains quite specific provisions: no boy with a beard, long hair or shaved head will be admitted on campus in September. In the same way, t-shirts and sweat shirts, as well as all sportswear are not accepted outside sports periods during the week. The campus shop is well stocked with Lacoste-style polo shirts, shirts and pullovers, and can quickly provide clothing for those who did not pack properly for the school term
- Jewellery, an inordinate number of handbags (US: purses) and designer clothes are strongly discouraged
- **Weekend Invitation Rules are extremely important**; you should note the dates of “blocked” weekends listed in the detailed first term calendar included in this booklet; you should also be careful to follow the procedure for weekend invitations which can be found in the Codes.

**As parents you are always welcome on campus; if you would like to meet teachers, please make an appointment to see them through Mme Danielle Llewellyn. We would be particularly happy to meet on five special occasions:**

1. **An Open Forum on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> September at 6.00 p.m.** You will be able to raise questions of all types concerning the structure of the school, discipline and relations between parents and the school with the Boarding directors and the school administration.
2. **The Christmas Celebrations on 4<sup>th</sup> December:** for those who wish there will be parent-teacher meetings during the morning; at the end of the afternoon there will be a classical concert, Christmas dinner, the French-speaking play, which will be dedicated to Jean-Bénédict Werner, and a rock concert to round off the evening. The Juniors’ Christmas celebrations will take place the day before.
3. **The Rosey Ski Races and Gstaad Weekend will begin on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> February, 2011**, with a University, College and Guidance information session for parents followed by the “Fondation” Gala Evening at the Eagle Club; Friday is reserved for the Rosey Races, the ice hockey match, and the AIAR evening – all followed by the “long weekend” on Saturday and Sunday.
4. **The Gstaad Charity Gala** traditionally takes place in the evening of the last Sunday in Gstaad, which this year is 6<sup>th</sup> March.
5. **The 131<sup>st</sup> End-of-Year celebrations** will take place on June 24<sup>th</sup> in the evening with concerts, English-speaking play and dinner, and on 25<sup>th</sup> June with the graduation ceremony and garden party.

# BACK TO SCHOOL CHECK-LIST

On Back to School Day, all parents are invited, especially those parents of students new to Le Rosey, to meet the different people in charge. We suggest the following “route” to make things easier:

- 1. The parents of girls (except Junior Girls)** are requested to start at La Combe on the Girls’ campus to meet the boarding directors and to leave their child’s luggage before coming back to Le Rosey. To make parking simpler, a shuttle service will operate between the two campuses.
- 2. At Le Rosey, posted signs will direct you from the car park to the hall at Vuilleumier** where a secretary will greet you in the reception area; and, if necessary, you will be asked fill out certain administrative documents.
3. Then in an order depending on numbers, you will rotate through a **series of steps**:
  - **at the Gymnasium, maison Vuilleumier**
    - **the Doyens and the Counsellors will meet with you** to discuss your child’s choice of language and programme of study, the exams, the school calendar..
    - **you will meet with the school nurses** to fill out students’ medical dossiers, to discuss any dietary requirements, and exchange health information
    - **you will meet with representatives from the IT department** in order to confirm your computer orders (whether they are rented or bought), to pick up computers turned in to us and to process orders that weren’t made previously
    - **you will choose uniforms**, sports material and winter gear.
  - **in the auditorium, the sports and arts programmes** will be presented as well as those for expeditions, and mid-term trips.
  - **at the Café and on the terrace**, you will meet for a welcome drink with the Director of Admissions and the *Comité des élèves*. It is also a meeting point with the Heads of House and the Boarding staff.
  - **at the Château**, you will meet with the Director of boys’ Boarding.
  - **Juniors’ parents** will meet the Director of Boarding in the Juniors’ House, Maison Hughes.

# Extract from the “Codes”: Parents’ responsibilities

Common sense tells us that Le Rosey cannot modify its educational approach to fit those of all the families who have entrusted their children to the school; it is these families, who have chosen Le Rosey, with its disciplinary principles and values, who must adapt. We are aware that this is not always easy – nor is it always welcome – but if the Rosey experience is to be successful, much will depend on the collaboration between parents and school: how can we expect students to respect rules to which their parents accord little attention or importance?

In consequence, we offer a number of friendly suggestions.

- **It can be very useful to read the Codes and discuss them with your children.** Le Rosey’s values and disciplinary principles will be better understood and respected if they have been approved and adopted by parents. Respect for the Codes is essential for community life and safety at Le Rosey.
- **We know how difficult it is for parents to accept the concept of “One Rule for All”.** It is nevertheless essential for balance in community life and for creating a sense of equal treatment. Every “special request”, such as a postponed sanction, an early weekend or holiday departure, appears innocuous: yet multiplied many times over by dozens of families, it makes community life impossible to manage.
- **Instantaneous communication between parents scattered across the world and their children at Le Rosey represents enormous progress,** allowing close family ties and a greater sense of security. There are, however, other, less manageable consequences: students can become less independent, they can take longer to settle in, a barrier between school and student can appear, and rapid emotional reactions can be encouraged.
- **Parents who do not give in to the pressure of their children** in the following three areas deserve special recognition:
  1. the “others” always have more money than I do (pocket money is distributed weekly at Rosey, and most parents apply reasonable limits to the extra money they might provide for possible supplementary purchases or special occasions.)
  2. the “others” can come home when they want on Saturday evening at the weekend (if teachers’ experience on Monday morning is anything to go by, there are those who have reasonable bedtimes and who are prepared for school, and others who are less so)
  3. others’ parents are cool, never say “no” and have a great family atmosphere (in the long term, this is indeed cool: in the longer term, it can be catastrophic, leading to young people living without restraint and with no confidence in their parents.).
