

Information on obtaining a student visa & Swiss residency permit

We would be grateful if you could send us a copy of your child's valid passport.

If the future student holds a current passport from one of these countries, he/she can travel freely in and out of Switzerland.

Visa required for entry into Switzerland

For students who are citizens of a country which is not listed above, a student visa (D) for entry into Switzerland is required. As soon as the student has been accepted at Le Rosey, parents must submit a visa request in their country of residence at the nearest Swiss Embassy/Consulate.

The procedure for requesting a student visa is quite long and may take up to three months. We would strongly recommend that you begin the process of obtaining a student visa for Switzerland as soon as possible.

Documents to be provided by Le Rosey for your dossier: These documents will be sent by email; should you wish to receive the hard copies by mail please contact the Travel Office:

attestation of school attendance
promise to leave Switzerland once studies are complete (must be signed by the student)
confirmation of payment (issued by the accounting department once the school fees have been paid)

Documents which you must provide for the Swiss Embassy/Consulate:

- four good quality passport photos (not torn, creased or marked) with the face positioned in the centre of the photograph
- three visa request forms
- passport and valid residency permit (if necessary)
- proof of sufficient income such as the most recent monthly salary slip or bank statement
- a letter confirming that the student has been accepted into our school
- a CV (only for students over the age of 14)
- a personal statement (for students over 14 years of age) in the form of letter written by the student indicating his/her reasons for choosing to study in Switzerland and his/her future aspirations once study in Switzerland is complete
- other documents may be required depending on the country of residence.

Arrival in Switzerland

As soon as your child arrives in Switzerland, the Travel Office obtains a Swiss residence permit for him/her to travel within the Schengen area for one year (usually until 30 September of the following year). Every summer, the Travel Office takes care of the renewal of all Swiss permits.
